# Parish Council 'Round-up' May

## Road Safety in Keyingham

As noted in the last *'Forward'* Parish Council members had been disappointed to receive notification that the public meeting scheduled for the 26<sup>th</sup> March to be hosted by ERYC Highways and Planning Teams would need to be rearranged due to illness.

The rescheduled meeting, which took place on 11<sup>th</sup> May provided an opportunity for Councillors and the small group of residents who attended to listen to information regarding the following proposals:

- To reduce the width of the road at the site of the crossing
- To erect barriers/place bollards at the junction to prevent parking close to the crossing
- To raise the height of the flashing amber beacons to increase their visibility
- To amend the 30mph zone at the entrance to the village (east and west)
- To add new signage .

The proposals were met with mixed views regarding the crossing which residents felt should be a light controlled crossing with audible crossing alerts – i.e. a 'Pelican' rather than 'Zebra' type crossing and that the current proposals fell short of the requirements to adequately improve the safety of the crossing, especially for people with sight impairment,

the elderly and infirm to cross the road confidently and safely.

It was felt that the traffic survey, conducted during winter months, may not have adequately captured the pattern of usage, particularly of larger vehicles.

Concerns were expressed over the likely increase in larger traffic, which may struggle to pass through a narrower section of main street, for example during Harvest and at 'coast traffic' during peak holiday season.

The views of participants were noted and Cllr Claire Holmes agreed to follow up all queries and requests for information.

A regular attendee at PC meetings, Cllr Holmes will continue to provide regular updates at the public participation sections of the Keyingham Parish Council meetings.

## Keyingham Primary School Student Council

Tree planting which was to be carried out by members of the Student Council, on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> March; took place on a bright and chilly afternoon on 26<sup>th</sup> April. Members of the Student Council, assisted by Headteacher Mrs White and School Manager Mrs Richardson, were joined by Parish Clerk Julia Billaney and Parish Councillors Ray Lawton and Mel Smith. The student councillors planted 14 Trees on the southern boundary of the Saltaugh Road Amenity Area. The trees which

included Cherry and Rowan were part of a package of ‘Wild Harvest’ saplings to provide food and shelter for wildlife. Everyone agreed that the planting provided a great tribute to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth’s Platinum Jubilee and a lasting legacy for the Village of Keyingham.
