Parish Council 'Round-up'

Since the last 'Roundup' we have had what was mostly a beautiful summer and the weather held up for harvest, though it now seems to have become Autumn all of a sudden! Social activities are gradually returning to 'face to face' events and we are beginning to be able to cautiously plan to travel further afield once more.

During the Summer the Council received and responded to challenges and queries relating to the Boyes Lane Recreation Ground Charity. Many learning points and opportunities for development arose from these interactions and the Trustees will pick up and continue to work through each of the issues raised via their annual cycle of meetings. The next meeting of the Trustees will take place on 15th October, following the Parish Council meeting.

While the sun was shining the play equipment on Eastfield Road Amenity Field was given a new coat of paint. Thanks go to Cllr. Mark Ward and Cllr. Ray Lawton for doing the painting and to Crown Paints who donated the materials.

We are very pleased to announce that post of Street Cleaner, has now been filled! Please give a warm welcome to Roger Kellington who took up post

on the 20th of September and is enjoying getting to grips with the job! A big thank you must also be recorded to David Kinnear who provided an 'on the job' induction for Roger and to Cllr. Lesley Maxwell who has cleared litter from the Green on a daily basis. The Council asks that everyone helps to keep our village looking tidy by encouraging a positive attitude to 'zero littering' of all kinds, from sweet wrappers to dog waste.

In the last '*Forward*' we noted the resignations of Councillors and were planning the campaign to recruit new members. We are now delighted to announce that, at the close of the poll on 30th September the returning officer of the East Riding of Yorkshire confirmed that the following people were duly elected to join the membership of Keyingham Parish Council: **Fran Beardow, Ricky Hoggard, Dave Medforth and Ed Stephenson.**

We would like to thank all the candidates who put themselves forward to help support their community as a Parish Councillor and extend a very warm welcome to the new members. A full, updated list of serving councillors and how to contact them will be added to the website and notice boards over the next few days

On 14th November we will once again be taking part in a Remembrance Pa-

rade followed by the laying of wreaths at the War Memorial. There will be a Service of Remembrance in St. Nicholas Church at 10.00am. It will be important to observe all the usual safety measures and appropriate social distancing, however we hope that as many people as are able to do so will join in this annual event.

We have been successful in applying for a large pack of trees as part of the ‘**Queens Green Canopy**’ to celebrate her 70 year reign. The Parish Council supported by the **Keyingham Academy Student Council** will be planting trees in and around Keyingham on a variety of sites as part of a shared commitment to reduce carbon in the atmosphere and create a lasting legacy for the future of the village. The trees will arrive in March which will allow time for the Student Council members to approach local businesses to seek their support for this project as part of their plan to improve the learning and social environment for everyone in Keyingham. There will be a longer feature on the Student Council and its projects and activities in the next issue, however I would like to say what a pleasure it was to meet them and begin working with them on their ideas for the School and the community of Keyingham.

Cllr Claire Holmes, ERYC, a regular attendee at Parish Council meetings, continues to offer her support to the work to improve road safety in Key-

ingham. The PC receive updates from Cllr. Holmes on progress towards improved safety measures, including road markings, barriers and supporting the police to clamp down on inappropriate parking and unsafe manoeuvres. Over the next few weeks the we will be working with residents and MKN Building Supplies on replacing and repositioning the ‘Save our Children’ sign and applying to extend the 30mph limit along the A1033 towards Ottringham as far as the Keyingham Parish boundary.

At the September meeting the letter of Conclusion of Audit was received from our External Auditor. The two stages of Audit of the Accounts for the financial year 2020/21 is now complete and the signed-off Annual Governance and Accountability Review (AGAR) has been published on the website.


The next scheduled meeting of the PC is 7.30pm on Wednesday 13th October in Keyingham Village Hall (Main Hall)

It is the time of the year when we remember all those who have made sacrifices to try and benefit their fellow human beings. This year two events are taking place over an extended period from the 6th to the 14th November.

Weekends sat/sun/6th/7th and sat/sun 13th/14th November from 12 noon to 3 pm St Nicholas church will be open to view the remembrance memorabilia flower and poppy festival. This event has been created to coincide with Duncan Kirk's poppies which will be on display in the church grounds. Refreshments will be served in Church.

On the 14th: 10:00 Service of Remembrance will take place at St Nicholas Church followed by commemoration at the War Memorial.

During the two weeks from the 6th November, Duncan Kirk will be displaying over 1000 poppies which he has made and which have been sponsored by people of Keyingham.

Duncan says he has crafted and handmade various silhouette figures and will have made over 1000 poppies for the display. He is asking that the people of the village kindly sponsor a poppy with 100% of the money raised going to the Royal British Legion. After the final amount has been donated, will publish a receipt on Facebook and in a later edition of the 'Forward'.

Poppies will have a minimum donation of £1, and arrangement of the donation can occur by ringing or texting 07780092800 (Ellie Kirk) or messaging Ellie Kirk (Keyingham) on Facebook and all poppies sponsored will be placed in the display.
